This includes 4 credits from required courses and 24 credits from core optional courses. Masters students are required to write a thesis and undergo an academic degree oral defense to fulfill the academic requirements. The Master's thesis is not included in the total graduation credit count. Elective courses are not limited by academic years. The credits earned from elective courses can be recognized by other departments or colleges, with a maximum limit of 9 credits. Academic Ethics are required courses for 0 credits. In accordance with Regulations of KNU Academic Ethics Courses, students could apply for academic degree oral defense after passing the academic ethics courses. These courses regulations were passed at the Curriculum Committee Meeting on May 23th, 2023, and approved for future references by Academics Affairs Meeting on May 23th, 2023.
